WATCH OUT CABLES ABOUT

Electricity can jump gaps -Always try to stay at least <u>5 METRES</u> away from overhead electricity equipment. The use of large agricultural machinery can bring farmers and agricultural contractors close to overhead power lines, so always take extra care when working near the electricity network.





Never use a mechanical excavator near electricity cables. If you are installing drainage, digging foundations or sinking fence posts then be aware that there may be electricity cables in the ground you are about to dig.

Make sure any contractors working on the farm or anyone making a delivery is made fully aware of the route the electricity network takes. If possible, keep access routes well away from overhead power lines.



Always have cable drawings with you on site and check them before you start excavating. These can be requested from NIE Networks by calling 03457 643 643.



Ensure everyone on the farm is aware of the location of the electricity network by marking overhead power lines and their voltages on your farm maps.



Harvesting, cutting silage, spraying crops and trimming trees can bring farmers and agricultural workers into close proximity with the electricity network so always remember to Look Up and Look Out for Overhead power lines.

If Vehicles or Plant come into contact with the electricity network don't climb out. If it is not safe to stay in the cab jump as far from the cab as possible. Land with both feet together ensuring you are never in contact with the machine and the ground at the same time. Never return to the machinery and keep all people well away.
